Challenge 1: Fast forward to the future of guiding with our Centenary Camp Challenge



There are two parts to this Challenge: Part A is open to Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Senior Section and Part B is open to Brownies, Guides and Senior Section. As long as your section is eligible, you can enter for either or both parts.

Please note that although the challenges are linked to the Girlguiding UK Centenary Camp Heritage Zone, you don't have to be attending the Camp to take part!

So what do you win? A VIP day out at the Camp or a host of Camp souvenirs! And the winning entries will be made up and on show for all to see - and might even be in use - during the Camp...

Centenary Camp Challenge Part A: Design a camper of the future



Draw a picture of a Rainbow/Brownie/ Guide/Senior Section member from the year 2110. What will she look like? What kind of uniform will she wear? What will her name be? The winning pictures will be on display in the 2010 Camp and may even be worn by some willing campers!

Centenary Camp Challenge, Part B: Design a camp gadget of the future



Design and draw a picture of a camp gadget you think might exist in 2110. Please provide a description of how it might work and what its purpose will be. The winning designs will be made up and on display (and maybe even in use!) at the 2010 Camp.



How to enter

- Entries for the Centenary Camp Challenge must be received by **1 April 2010**.
- Only three entries may be submitted per unit. If more than three members of the unit wish to take part, then vote on the best three designs in each category, and submit those. Each entry may include only one picture or design.
- Your pictures and designs should each be displayed on a sheet of paper no larger than A4 in size.
- Ensure that names, contact and unit details are clearly marked on the entries.
- If you are a winner, you will be invited to spend a VIP day with us at the Centenary Camp on Wednesday 4 August 2010. You will get a tour of the Camp, see your winning pictures on display or designs in action, and be able to take part in Fusion, the Girlguiding UK open-air performing arts festival. If you are unable to attend the Camp in person, we will send you camp souvenirs and pictures of your winning pictures on display or designs in action. A parent or Leader will be required to accompany any winning members to the Camp.

Challenge 2: Design an iconic centrepiece for the Centenary Camp venue



We need an amazing, truly eye-catching structure to act as the centre-piece or even the special entrance to the Centenary Camp - and we'd like YOU to design it!

The creator of the winning design will get a VIP visit to the Centenary Camp where their iconic structure will, of course, have pride of place.

This challenge is separate from Challenge 1 (see opposite); however, you can enter both and submit your ideas in the same envelope if you wish. This challenge is open to all sections.

Remember that while we're looking for spectacular designs, we are working within a budget, so please think about how your structure can be made in a cost-effective way too.
